### Our Club Ethos

Young Irelands GAA & Camogie Club promotes **respect, enjoyment, inclusion, fair play and pride in our community**. All members are expected to uphold these values on and off the field, including online.

### Players

Players are expected to:

- Play fairly, follow the rules and give their best effort.
- Show respect to teammates, opponents, coaches, officials and supporters.
- Accept decisions of referees without dissent.
- Support and encourage teammates at all times.
- Be gracious in defeat and modest in victory.
- Represent the club with pride and good behaviour.

Players must not:

- Use foul, abusive, racist, sectarian or discriminatory language.
- Bully, intimidate or deliberately harm others.
- Argue with officials or show dissent.
- Play or train while injured or unwell without informing a coach.

### Parents & Guardians

Parents/Guardians are expected to:

- Encourage children to play by the rules and enjoy their participation.
- Respect referees, coaches, volunteers and all players.
- Applaud good play and effort from all teams.
- Support a balanced approach to sport, education and wellbeing.

Parents/Guardians must not:

- Shout instructions, criticise players or referees, or place undue pressure on children.
  - Enter the field of play unless authorised by an official.
  - Use negative or abusive language or behaviour.
